



Preparing Children for First Sacraments – Catholic Schools Process First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Holy Communion (Eucharist)

The celebration of the Sacraments is central to the life of the St. Bartholomew faith community. The process to receive sacraments is required to take place through a parish formation program - including children enrolled in [Catholic schools](#).

Baptized children entering grades 2-5, who are seeking to receive First Sacraments (Reconciliation and First Communion) are required to register through a parish preparation process. We would welcome your participation in the St. Bart's First Sacraments preparation process.

Preparing for First Sacraments is a seven month, two-part preparation process that includes:

- **Scan the QR Code** above to access the Catholic Schools First Sacraments Online Registration.
- **Part 1 - First Reconciliation Parents Only Orientation Session** - Select a session in October during the Registration process. First Reconciliation materials will be handed out and reviewed with the expectation that parents complete at-home lessons before attending Activity Learning Stations.
 - **Choose between: Sun., October 8, 11:45am, Room A14 or Wed., October 11, 6:30pm, A14**
 - **Activity Learning Stations** will include at least one parent/guardian with your daughter/son. You will have the option during the Registration process to select 1 of 4 sessions in December or January. The Learning Stations provide an opportunity for the candidates to review what they've learned and practice in anticipation of their first confession.
 - **Choose between 1 of 4: Saturday, Dec. 2, 2023, 9:00 – 11:30am OR 1:00 – 3:30pm - or - Saturday, January 6, 2024, 9:00am – 11:30am OR 1:00 – 3:30pm**
 - **Experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)** at a Communal Reconciliation Service scheduled for **Thursday, January 11, 2024, 6:30pm**. Parents and older siblings are welcome to receive the sacrament also. After successfully completing part one, your family can move on to part two of the process.
- **Part 2 - First Holy Communion (Eucharist) Preparation** follows a similar process. During the Registration process, select a Parents Only Orientation session in February 2024. Parents will once again receive resources to complete at-home lessons before attending Activity Learning Stations.
 - **Choose between: Sun., February 4, 2024, 11:45am, Room A14 or Wed., Feb. 7, 6:30pm, A14.**
 - **During this Orientation session you will provided a Sign-up Genius link to select a scheduled rehearsal date as well as a weekend Mass time at which the candidates will receive their First Holy Communion.**
 - **Activity Learning Stations** will include at least one parent with your daughter/son. You will have the option during the Registration process to select 1 of 4 sessions in April. The Learning Stations provide an opportunity for the candidates to review what they've learned and practice in anticipation of their First Holy Communion (Eucharist).
 - **Choose between 1 of 4: Saturday, April 20, 2024, 9:00 – Noon OR 1:00 – 4:00pm - or - Saturday, April 27, 2024, 9:00am – Noon OR 1:00 – 4:00pm**

- **First Holy Communion (Eucharist) Rehearsal** will take place the week before they receive their First Holy Communion. Details provided at the First Eucharist Parent
 - Parents will be given the opportunity to sign-up for a rehearsal date during the February First Holy Communion Parent Orientation session.
 - Candidates will rehearse Mass responses and practice how to receive Holy Communion.
 - Specific instructions will be provided at the rehearsal.
- **First Holy Communion Mass** - Candidates' families will **select between 1 of 4** weekend Masses, **May 4 & 5, 2024.**
